Good afternoon,

When we have a significant amount of rainfall in a short period of time it is not uncommon that a fish kill occurs. This is due to the cold rain water mixing with the warm water and inturn mixing the water body and flipping the dissolved oxygen from the bottom of the waterway to the top. Unfortunately, some fish don't react quickly enough to this where they stay where there isn't any oxygen left resulting in a fish kill. During the rainy season we see this event in multiple communities across Florida since we have high volumes of rainfall in the afternoon.
